Students will learn the key elements of understanding and implementing God's Word into life. The course begins with establishing the Bible as the word of God, by confirming verbal inspiration (every word is inspired by God) and canonicity (the 66 books are the complete and exclusive revelation of God.). Students will survey the history of the English Bible by learning about the manuscripts and trace their role in the different Bible versions. Students are introduced to the different study helps for deeper study. Actual Bible study approaches are discussed including a literary review of God's diverse ways of presenting truth. Students should then be equipped to more effectively handle difficult passages, knowing the issues involved in reaching a solution and application to their lives. *TBHF \$90.00 | |

Students will create, evaluate, and participate in written and verbal communications projects that will teach godly values, understanding, and delivery approaches to becoming an effective communicator for Christ.
